AWARD-WINNING FILMMAKER DAVID VASSER TO OPEN NEW RAE DOROUGH SPEAKER SERIES WITH CLIPS AND DISCUSSION OF FILMS ABOUT YOSEMITE

LIVERMORE – David Vasser, an Emmy-winning and Oscar-nominated documentary filmmaker, will kick off the 2017-18 Rae Dorough Speaker Series with a presentation of "Yosemite and Hetch Hetchy: Why National Parks?" at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 5 in the Bankhead Theater.

Vasser, who has 30 years experience producing films about the natural world, will show segments from his films that feature Yosemite "as the birthplace of the national park idea," discuss the historic context of the film clips and offer insights into how the films were made. Coming in the wake of the centennial celebration of the national parks and at a time when the role of the national parks is being called into question, Vasser's presentation is timely.

From the first film he produced about Yosemite at age 19 to his latest about the fate of the American desert, Vasser has been ahead of his time, often leading the discussion about critical environmental issues. His films have appeared on PBS as well as other channels and he was a primary director of the acclaimed NBC series Unsolved Mysteries. "It's been a wild ride," said David Vassar in a 2016 interview for an event marking the centennial of the national parks. "I've told stories about America's great National Parks, treasured and lost landscapes, and epic conservation battles. People will protect what they love, and documentaries bring the issues, people, wildlife and landscapes home. I hope we've made a difference; there's more to be done."
